

Up Next: After April vacation, students will be reading *The Giver* by Lois Lowry.


Highlights: Students have begun argumentative writing. They have started the process with a short persuasive writing assignment, followed by a short argument writing assignment adding in direct quotes, in-text citations, and a works cited. Students will finish the unit with a longer on demand argument writing assignment scored as a summative. Students have been using the CER framework (Claim, Evidence, Reasoning) all year and are also using it as a format when writing their body paragraphs.







Highlights: Students are now working at their own pace trying to get through the last few books. THEY DO HAVE HOMEWORK. They need to bring book home every night and work no more than 20 minutes per night. Once they finish a topic, they will have a quiz and can progress.



This week, students **gathered data** to figure out how mass and speed impact kinetic energy in a collision. They then figured out how to **graph** this data, which was a challenge that asked them to apply many different math and science skills!

In the last few weeks before break, we will review all of the different forces that can act on an object in a collision.
